

We are honoured to share new artworks from illustrators Jennifer Farley and Olivia Golden.

Enter the imaginative realms of classic literature: Jennifer Farley's whimsical artworks explore some of the most beloved characters and iconic locations from timeless literary works.

Ireland has a rich history of seeking out strength and magic in the creatures that surround us for stories that both enthral and entertain. Olivia Golden's artworks celebrate those qualities with simple and striking textural compositions.

Olivia Golden is an illustrator from Mayo, based in Cork city. She has illustrated over 30 books for children of all ages featuring dragons, snails, mermen and even time a spot of travel. Titles include Scéalta le hInsint don Ghealach (written by Caoimhe Nic Lochlainn) and Cillian ag Comhaireamh (written by Siobhain Grogan). She has a particular interest in all things Irish, the language, the people, the places and folklore. Texture and light combined with simple compositions, strong colour and contrast constitute the heart of Olivia's visual style. Her work has been exhibited both nationally and internationally. Frankie's World is Aoife's first graphic novel, based on her real-life experiences of autism after having been diagnosed as an adult in 2018.
